ELIGIBILITY

1. **All exhibitors are required to read and abide by the Georgia National Fair General Rules And Regulations.**

Hobbies Department Rules also govern this competition. **PLEASE NOTE...IT IS YOUR RESPONSIBILITY TO READ AND UNDERSTAND THE RULES. If you have questions, you may certainly e-mail us at contests@gnfa.com. Please help us prevent entry disqualifications.**

2. All items in this Department must be entered at the same Skill Level.

3. *Please see Budding Artists for opportunities for children younger than 12.*

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

4. Exhibitors may enter as many classes as they wish, but not more than two entries per class (except where stated otherwise), and each entry must exhibit a different style, design, or purpose. Up to 5 items allowed in "Other Not Listed" classes, as long as each entry is different by style, design, or purpose, and items do not fit in another category. The "Other Not Listed" category may not be used as a means to exceed the limitation of two items per class.

5. All exhibits that require hanging for display should be brought wired

and ready to hang. **Pictures without a hanger will not be judged or displayed. (No sawtooth hangers accepted.)**

6. All entries in this department will be displayed at the discretion of the management.

7. **Attention teachers and group leaders: Please do not submit more than two works from the same class project if the project produces look-alike pieces.**

JUDGING

8. Judges are instructed not to award premiums unless articles are deemed worthy of merit. Articles without competition will be judged on their own merit and will receive awards only if deemed meritorious by the judges. The decisions of the judges will be final.

9. Judges may subclass where necessary.

PREMIUMS

10. All premium money will be paid from the judges' record sheets and not from ribbons that may be attached to the exhibits. Premium checks will be mailed within six weeks after the Fair is over.

11. Award of Excellence Rosette may be given in each Division.

Beads of Courage, Inc. is a 501(c) 3 tax-exempt organization dedicated to helping children with serious illness record and tell their own stories of survival. Children are given a bead each time they are "poked" (with a needle) or undergo a procedure. Woodworkers and Wood Turners have been asked to create lidded boxes for these children to use to store their many beads.

Bead Bowls/Boxes Guidelines:

- Beads of Courage members may receive thousands of beads. It is desirable for your boxes to hold them all. As a result, turned or rectangular lidded boxes need to be large. Larger is better! Recommended interior dimensions for turned boxes are: 6" diameter (5" minimum), 5" height (4" minimum). Recommended interior dimensions for flatwork boxes are: 4" x 6" x 4".
- Box bases should be wide enough so the box is stable and does not tip over easily. Lids for Beads of Courage boxes should be easy for small or ill children to remove or lift. Any finials should be easy for a small child to grasp and not too elaborate so they don't break. Avoid excessively elaborate designs that may easily

break or be damaged; remember, hospital rooms have limited storage space.

- Finishing of boxes is extremely important! Beads of Courage members who receive these boxes are susceptible to germs/infections/mold. Bowls that have not been properly sealed can harbor mold. Please contain toxic materials. Also do not use finishes like linseed oil that take a long time to outgas.
- All kinds of wood are beautiful! Please refrain from painting Beads of Courage boxes. Instead, highlight the beauty of the wood with clear varnish, a stain, and/or burning.
- If possible, please purchase the Woodturner Donation Incentive Package. The package includes personalized Woodworker Artist cards and individual Beads of Courage® ceramic logo bead in their design (20 beads for \$25.00 with free shipping). If this is not possible, you can find a way to engrave, burn or letter "Beads of Courage" onto the lid or side of the box. Designed specifically for your donation, each logo bead purchased comes with a Woodworker Artist card that includes your personal signature. Ceramic logo beads can be purchased at www.beadsofcourage.org Artists Information for Woodturners.
- It is nice if you can personalize your donation. Marking your name or initials, type(s) of wood, and date on the box bottom is one way. It is also nice to include a personal note of encouragement, business card, etc. inside the box.

Beads of Courage Boxes will be displayed separately and will be eligible for the following awards:
