ELIGIBILITY

1. **All exhibitors are required to read and abide by the Georgia National Fair General Rules And Regulations.**

PLEASE NOTE...IT IS YOUR RESPONSIBILITY TO READ AND UNDERSTAND THE RULES. If you have questions, you may certainly e-mail us at contests@gnfa.com. Please help us prevent entry disqualifications.

2. All items in this Department must be entered at the same Skill Level.

3. There are many different division levels in the Hobbies department. These are based on *skill level*, allowing a broad spectrum of participation while providing a fair system for judging purposes. The honor system is used with regard to the proper Division placement for exhibitors. In other words, it is left to the exhibitors to determine under which Division he/she should exhibit. Judges may move entries to the next higher level if the work merits.

The **Novice Division** is intended for those new to the art and at the very basic beginner level.

The **Intermediate Division** is the average skill level where most exhibitors will enter.

The **Open Division** is offered for the more advanced exhibitor whose projects demonstrate more complexity of design. The amateur exhibitor whose work is competitive at a higher than average level of his/her art and professionals will enter in this category.

The **Youth Division** is for those exhibitors ages 12-18.

4. *Please see Budding Artists for opportunities for children younger than 12.*

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

5. Exhibitors may enter as many classes as they wish, but not more than two entries per class (except where stated otherwise), and each entry must exhibit a different style, design, or purpose. Up to **3** items allowed in "Other Not Listed" classes, as long as each entry is different by style, design, or purpose, and items do not fit in another category. The "Other Not Listed" category may not be used as a means to exceed the limitation of two items per class.

6. All exhibits that require hanging for display should be brought wired and ready to hang. **Pictures without a hanger will not be judged or displayed. (No sawtooth hangers accepted.)**

7. The name of any pattern used should be listed on the entry form or in the notes section of online entry.

8. **Attention teachers and group leaders: Please do not submit more than two works from the same class project if the project produces look-alike pieces.**

JUDGING

9. Judges are instructed not to award premiums unless articles are deemed worthy of merit. Articles without competition will

be judged on their own merit and will receive awards only if deemed meritorious by the judges. The decisions of the judges will be final.

PREMIUMS

10. All premium money will be paid from the judges' record sheets and not from ribbons that may be attached to the exhibits. Premium checks will be mailed within six weeks after the Fair is over.

11. Award of Excellence Rosette may be given in each Division.

12. Sweepstakes Plaque and \$25 may be presented to winner of the most blue ribbons in Creative Crafts Adult/Open and Youth Divisions.
